Visiting Blarney GAA Club

This guide will help you know what to do and what to expect when you visit Blarney GAA Club



Arriving



You can travel by car, bus, or walking.
The main entrance has gates.
There is a car park inside the club gates.
Watch out for moving cars.



Arriving at the GAA club

You will see a large grass pitch to your right
You can enter through the gate on the fence
when they are open.



You will see an astroturf pitch behind the club house .

Inside the club house

You can enter the clubhouse through the main doors. You will see a corridor with a noticeboard.

Along the corridor you will find doors to:

- a meeting room,
- the locker rooms,
- a small kitchen
- a large hall, and
- toilets.

If it is too noisy I can wear headphones or earplugs



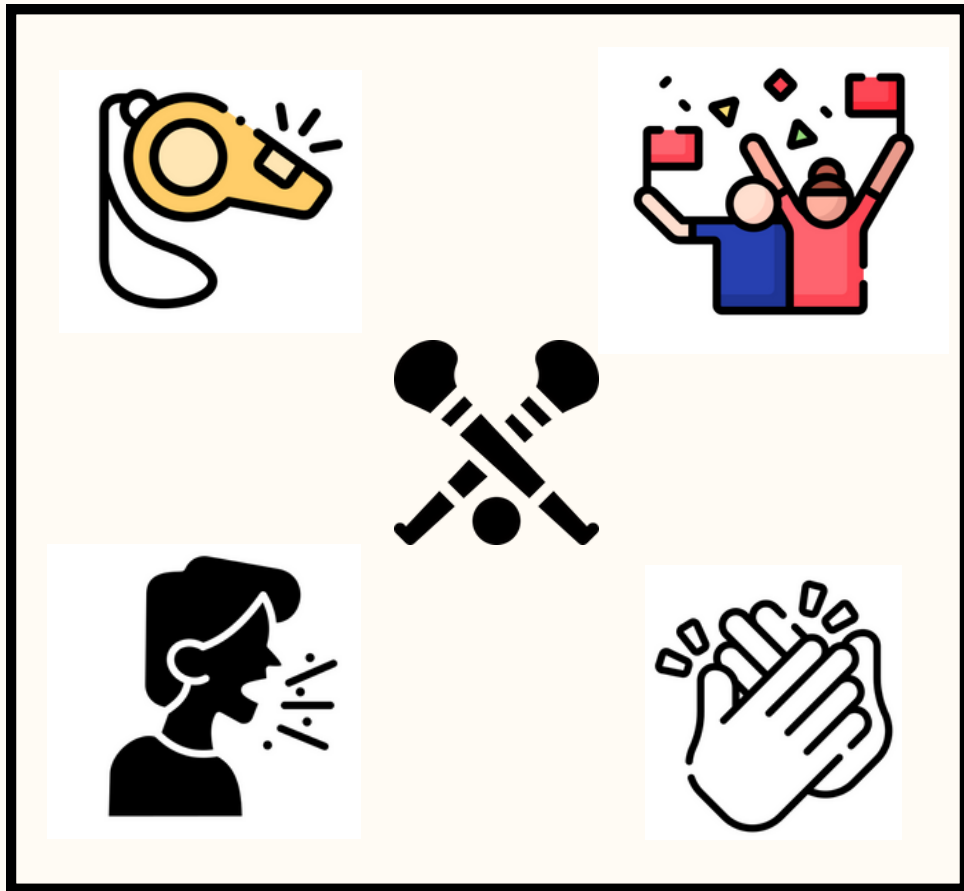
Grass

You can watch from the side lines

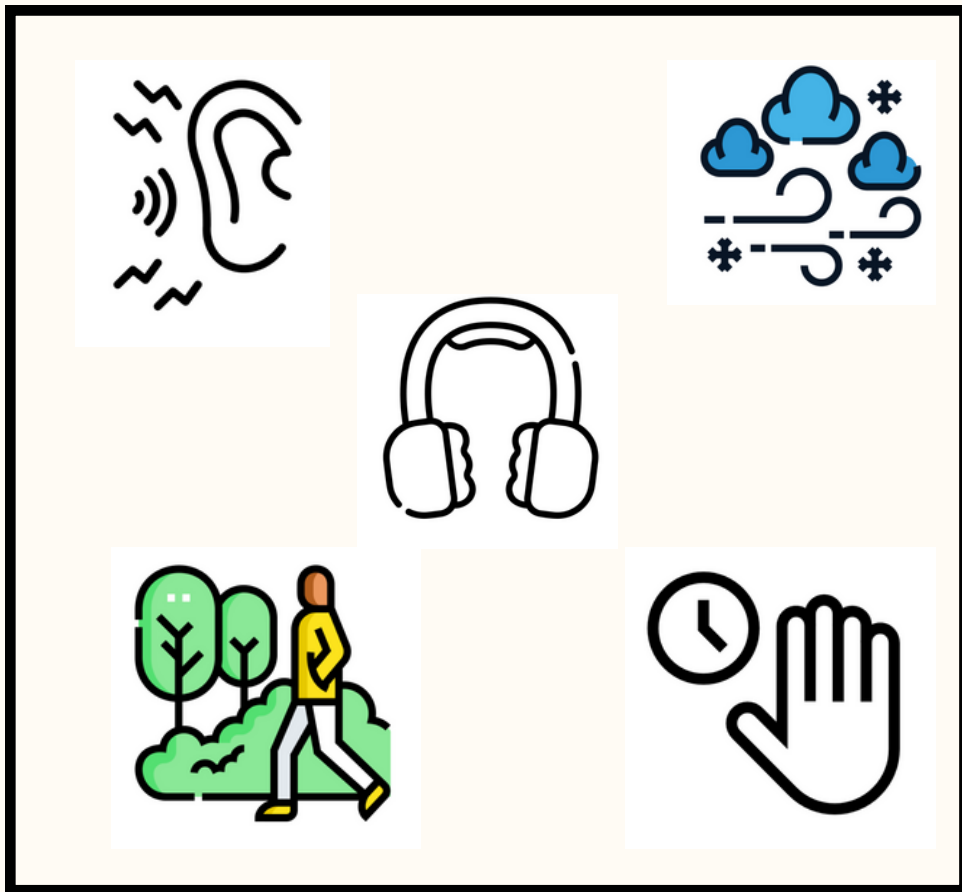
You can watch from the raised grass viewing

- cheering,
- shouting,
- clapping,
- hurley's hitting the ball or each other



Sensory information

It can be busy and noisy on match days.

You can wear ear defenders.

The weather can be cold and windy.

You can wear warm coats and use an umbrella.

There is lots of room to walk around if you need a break.

You can take a break in the club house.



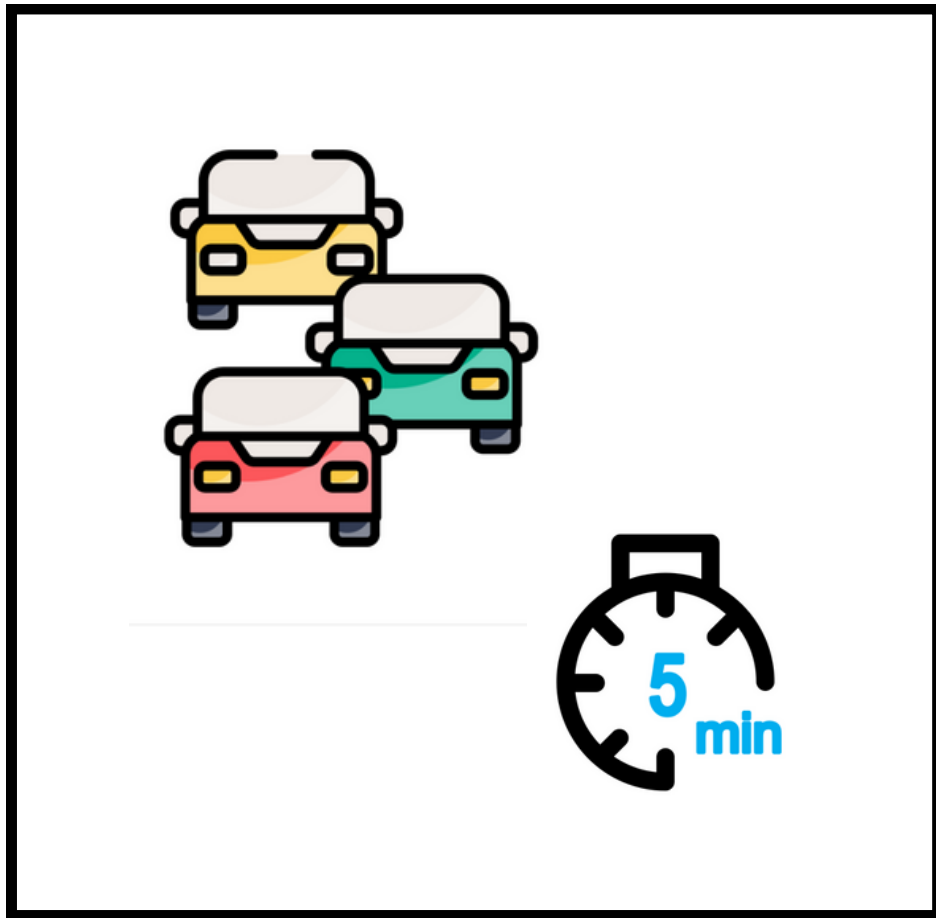
Sensory information

Sometimes matches and training take place after dark. There are big lights that light up the pitches when it is dark. These lights are very bright.



Communication Board

Blarney GAA have a communication board on display at their astroturf pitch.
You can use this to help you communicate.

It might feel busy and loud.

You can wait a few minutes if you prefer a quieter exit.
