Club Ceoil Blarney classes take place in Gaelscoil Mhuscrai.


You can park in the schools carpark or on the street behind the Blarney Filling Station.

You may hear different instruments or music.


You may smell cleaning products.

Sometimes the Gaelscoil cleaner tidies up during Club Ceoil.




Taking a Class

If you join a class, your music teacher will show you what to do. We teach music by ear, but also provide visual cues and visual guides (ABC notes and staff music notation). You can follow along or just listen during the class. It's ok to ask any question or rest if you need to.



Staying Safe

It's important to mind your own ears while listening and playing music. Use ear protection if you like. Our teachers will never play too loud, and neither should you. We will teach you to hold the instrument in the correct way to prevent injury.



Taking Breaks

Most of our classes are only 30 minutes. But, if you ever need a break, you are very welcome to pause in a quieter space of the room or out in the corridor.




Concerts and Performances

Club Ceoil organised concerts every term. You are welcome to join us in the audience or as a performer. These days will be louder and more busy, but we will let you know in advance that this will happen. If you prefer, you can audio or video record your performance instead of performing live during concerts or recitals.



Fidget toys, ear defenders, drinks

You are very welcome to bring your own fidget toys, ear defenders or water to drink. Because Club Ceoil Blarney is only a guest in the Gaelscoil, we're not allowed to touch the school's toys or equipment.



Finishing your visit

At the end of the class, the teacher will tell & write down what to practice. We will say goodbye. When you are finished music, you can leave the Gaelscoil through the same doors. If you would like, the teacher can walk you down to the exit.
